The Adventure:

Keep the planet clean by putting litter in its place! Let's find out where different kinds of litter should go. What goes in the garbage? What can be recycled?

With some help from your Scouters, set up a recycling relay race. Each Lodge can race against the others. The first to sort all of its litter wins!

Things we need:

- Clean litter (pop cans, newspapers, magazines, cereal boxes, plastic bags, old clothing, broken toys, and so on)
- Recycling bins (blue boxes)
- Garbage cans

Safety note:

- The litter for this race should not have sharp edges.
 There are some items you should avoid having in your litter pile, such as cans that have been cut open and glass bottles or jars which could break when dropped.
- Wear gloves, and remember to wash your hands after your race.
