Plan.

- When and where will you share this adventure?
- · How will you decide what skills your Patrol will learn?
- What is the best way to learn these skills? How did the expert Scouts learn these skills themselves?
- · What gear do you need for this adventure? Will there be a cost to obtaining or using this gear?

- · Agree on one or more skills to learn as a Patrol from one or more Scouts in the Patrol.
- · Learn and practise a new skill!

Review:

- · What do you know now that you did not know before?
- For the Scout(s) teaching the skill—how hard was it to teach the other Scouts?
- What teaching techniques worked well? Does everyone in the Patrol agree, or did different approaches work better or worse for different Scouts?

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Safety Note:

- Specific precautions for learning a new skill will depend on the skill. Whatever it is that you are learning and practising, take some time first as a Patrol to talk about how everyone can stay safe. What should you be particularly mindful of?
- What safety equipment should you have on hand? A first aid kit is always a must. What else should you be prepared with?
